A VIEW FROM THE BRIDGE



Dear Friends,

Thank you for your support as the Conservancy returned to a fully dynamic year of public events programming, with new and returning participants enjoying activities throughout Brooklyn Bridge Park all season long.

It's clearer than ever that parks and public spaces are hugely important to people's lives. Brooklyn Bridge Park, in particular, provides a unique combination of waterfront access, recreational opportunities, and beautiful green spaces. We thank our colleagues at Brooklyn Bridge Park Corporation, led by BBP President Eric Landau, for continuing to build, improve, and provide such a vibrant space.

Highlights of the Conservancy's year included:

- **95,000** audience members enjoyed outdoor films, dance and theater performances, live music, and readings in the Park
- **25,000** students, families, and visitors learned about the importance of the plants and animals of the East River estuary
- **17,000** Park visitors enjoyed outdoor recreation programs, from free fitness Waterfront Workout classes, to kayaking and soccer leagues

We look forward to another robust program season, as we continue to present interactive and engaging events throughout the Park. In this coming year, we're excited to debut the first commissioned art installation at the Pier 3 Labyrinth, with an interactive musical performance by Angélica Negrón composed to utilize the uniquely built sound features of the space. We're also excited to bring dance socials to the wonderful new space at Emily Warren Roebling Plaza, which opened in December 2021. We continue to highlight BIPOC artists, creators, and partners, to uplift and celebrate underrepresented communities.

In addition to the popular public kayaking program, we're pleased to announce the return of our youth kayak program this summer. Run in partnership with The Kayak Foundation, this program allows young people from under-served communities to discover independence, recreation, and fun on the water while experiencing their city from a new perspective.

Our education team and stewardship teams are expanding our teen programming with TIDES (Teens Interested In and Dedicated to Environmental Stewardship) adding both apprentice and internship levels. The enhanced program allows students to build their conservation, sustainability, and stewardship knowledge through hands-on community service work, providing invaluable career and leadership skills, as well as exposure to environmental education and S.T.E.A.M. related career paths. Announced last fall, we also look forward to expanding of our Environmental Education Center, with development plans actively underway.

We thank all who have joined us in celebrating this past year, and look forward to continued growth, learning, and community, both within the Park and beyond.





ARTS & CULTURE

In 2022 the Conservancy welcomed over 95,000 participants in a robust season of programming, including 220 recreational, cultural, and educational events and programs in the Park.

The season kicked off with 1,000 visitors celebrating the second annual Brass Bands Festival, and Sounds at Sunset kept the music going with intimate live performances at Pier 3 Greenway Terrace. New programs included Summer Fridays, which featured live performances, meditations, and music to ease into the weekend; the upbeat dance party Big Summer Get Down with James St. Joy; and Waterfront Dance Socials, with introductory salsa and house dance classes. Brooklyn Americana's Womens Stage featured original live music from 30 women and women-identified LGBTQ+ and BIPOC artists. The Conservancy's Open Studios Residency program welcomed street dance company It's Showtime NYC, and youth and neurodiverse-oriented Trusty Sidekick Theater Company.

Movies With A View, in its 22nd year, returned with a full 8-week series of films. 37,000 visitors enjoyed the outdoor films, with food and drink provided by Smorgasburg, short films curated by BAM, DJ sets by Brooklyn Radio, and complimentary bike valet by Transportation Alternatives.





RECREATION

Staying active on the waterfront, nearly 17,000 participants took advantage of the Conservancy's free and low-cost fitness and recreational classes and clinics this season.

Waterfront Workouts featured free weekly fitness classes from May through September. Classes included morning Vinyasa Yoga, Sunset Yoga, Zumba, Pilates, and Amp'd Bootcamp, taught by instructors from local partners Dodge YMCA, Chelsea Piers Fitness, and Abhaya Yoga. International Day of Yoga featured multiple classes and wellness experiences and The Class returned for three heart-pumping sessions,

Provided in partnership with Brooklyn Bridge Park Boathouse, free public kayaking drew over 6,290 paddlers. Family Kayaking on Sundays let children kayak with their guardians, and allowed teenagers over 14 to get comfortable kayaking independently. The Conservancy's Youth Kayaking program will return in 2023, expanding access for kids and teens to explore the waterfront — many for the first time.

Over 370 kids, ages 13-17, came out to Pier 2 for free drills, training, and games over the course of the summer in basketball classes led by KING Hoops. The Conservancy's soccer leagues welcomed over 2,600 adult and youth players across the full season. Volleyball also remained popular, with 2,473 team players in the Conservancy leagues.

EDUCATION

From birders to campers to anglers, over 25,000 students, families, and park visitors enjoyed the Conservancy's environmental education school, camp, and public programs in 2022.

Students from Pre-K through high school came to the Conservancy's Education Center for hands-on classes that use Brooklyn Bridge Park as a living classroom. Students came from 51 different schools, across 32 zip codes and 21 council districts. 55% of these classes were from Title 1 schools, and 38% of young participants were ESL learners.

Throughout the summer, families participated in guided walks, fishing and seining clinics, and science lectures. Over 400 campers attended Trail Blazers day camp, offered in partnership with the Conservancy, and over 12,450 visitors came to the Conservancy's Environmental Education Center during public Open Hours on Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday, and Sundays afternoons.

The Early Nature Experiences Program, for children 2-3 years old, offered two class cohorts per spring, summer, and fall semester. In total, 144 children and caregivers participated in the program over the year, many developing life-long relationships with the Park, programs, and Environmental Education Center. The TIDES teen program, run along with the stewardship department, also rapidly expanded.

Over the course of the season, 650 Conservancy volunteers of all ages and skill sets generously donated over 3,500 hours to service projects in the Park. Stewardship opportunities included beach cleanups, horticulture projects, oyster monitoring, photography, and ongoing support at the Conservancy's movies, family festivals, and other large-scale events. While always eager to welcome new volunteers to the Park, the Conservancy was especially gratified by the support of returning volunteers (both individuals and groups), many of whom joined during the pandemic.

A joint program of the Conservancy's education and stewardship departments, TIDES (Teens Interested In and Dedicated to Environmental Stewardship) helped introduce 30 high school students from across the city to conservation, sustainability, and stewardship through a combination of hands-on workshops and community service projects in the Park. This year, nine TIDES graduates returned as TIDES apprentices, and four graduates returned as paid interns, building upon their skills by assisting staff during Open Hours, taking leadership roles with other students, and helping with public programs.
